Q1 WHEN HAVE YOU JOINED EUROFIMA, AND COULD YOU INTRODUCE YOURSELF?

My name is Adèle Legoupil and I am a risk analyst at Eurofima. I have a rich international background, having already lived in 5 different countries on 3 continents. I started my career in consulting in 2020 while finishing my Masters in economic policy. I am now happy to apply my acquired skillset and convictions at EUROFIMA, which I joined one year ago, where we forge the path to a cleaner future.

Q2 WOULD YOU PLEASE SHARE WITH US YOUR MAIN DAILY TASKS AND CURRENT PROJECTS?

My role in risk management covers a large variety of tasks ranging from risk identification, measurement, and monitoring, to controlling and reporting. An important topic this year has been the identification of change factors for some of our key risk indicators (KRIs) and the visualization of such in our various reports. Also in my scope of work, is the monitoring, understanding, and forecasting of our credit ratings. In addition, there are some ad-hoc tasks to measure the risk and pricing of potential future transactions or operations.
